Because many people visit and enjoy the Mount Penn Preserve throughout the year, we ask for your help in keeping the Preserve a safe and beautiful natural recreation area. For both your safety and the protection of the many natural resources of the area, we ask that you adhere to general rules while visiting:

- Preserve hours are dawn to dusk
- Vehicles are to be parked in designated parking areas
- Adhere to all posted speed limit signs
- Use existing trails only for riding or hiking
- No hunting
- Alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs and discharging of firearms is prohibited
- Radios and other sources of audio must be kept to a reasonable level to not disturb other Preserve visitors or the surrounding residential community

**PERMITS REQUIRED IN ADVANCE FOR:**

- Closing of any lanes of traffic
- Events of any type
- Sales of food, beverages or other merchandise

The Preserve features over 40 miles of trails to be used for equestrian, hiking and biking and is currently listed as a Silver rated area by the International Mountain Bicycling Association.
