BEWARE of INHERITANCE SCAMS targeting older Pennsylvanians!!!



The Pennsylvania Department of Aging is warning older adults to be alert for a new scam involving fake emails from individuals posing as Pennsylvania state employees. The reported scheme targets older Pennsylvanians by claiming they are owed a large inheritance and requesting upfront payments to access the funds. These scammers often use convincing language and spoofed email addresses that appear to come from official Commonwealth agencies.

"Older adults are often targeted due to the savings they've accumulated over a lifetime," said Pennsylvania Secretary of Aging Jason Kavulich. "Scams like these can devastate retirements and families. We urge older adults to talk to a trusted family member or contact their local Area Agency on Aging before responding to any suspicious messages."

What to Watch For:

- Emails or calls about unexpected inheritances or prizes.
- Requests for upfront payments or personal information.
- Emails that don't end in @pa.gov or websites that don't end in pa.gov.
- Pressure to act quickly or in secrecy.

What to Do:

- Never share personal or financial information with unknown contacts.
- Do not send money or cryptocurrency to strangers.
