 - o You have to work through barriers and design technology to meet your specific needs.
- Camden Coalition on Data-Driven Justice
 - o Health Information Exchange developed so 50 agencies can see the data (MH, Hospitals, EMS, Police, Providers, Etc.
- From Design to Implementation; Project 25, San Diego
 - o Head of ER collected data to ID top 25 utilizers by working with Police, EMS, MH and D&A Providers
- Working across Systems to Improve Outcomes
 - o Presenters from Denver, Franklin County, PA and Middlesex, MA
 - o Masters of MET – Money, Ego and Turf – need to work together at all levels of government and the private sector
- Integrating data Across Systems
 - o Information shared from NYC, Johnson Counties in KS and IA
 - o HIPAA considerations when gathering data, develop a way to view other databases, look at sustainability (people move on), look at cost benefit analysis – can we save money by identifying high utilizers – ex: non-emergent ambulance calls
